Guiding questions

The ADV BES will process personal data in the performance of its tasks (supporting discrimination), including both regular and special categories of data. Therefore, privacy protection and information security are necessary.

At the moment, there is no ADV on the BES islands yet. The implementation of the equal treatment legislation (draft law 'protection against discrimination on the BES islands', TK 36 551) also includes the establishment of an ADV on each BES island.

The Regulation constitutes the (mandatory) elaboration of article I, fifth paragraph, of the draft law 'protection against discrimination in the BES'.
